

I've been an athlete all of my life. Athletes never forget what it is like to feel "the thrill of victory." However, I must admit to having dealt with the agony of defeat more often.

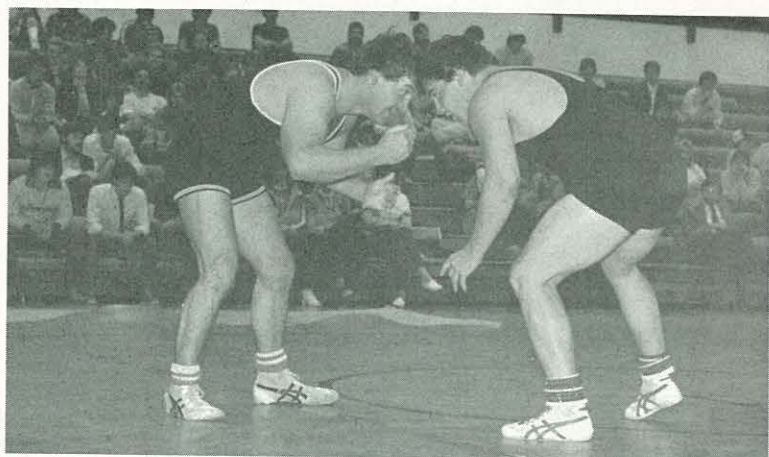

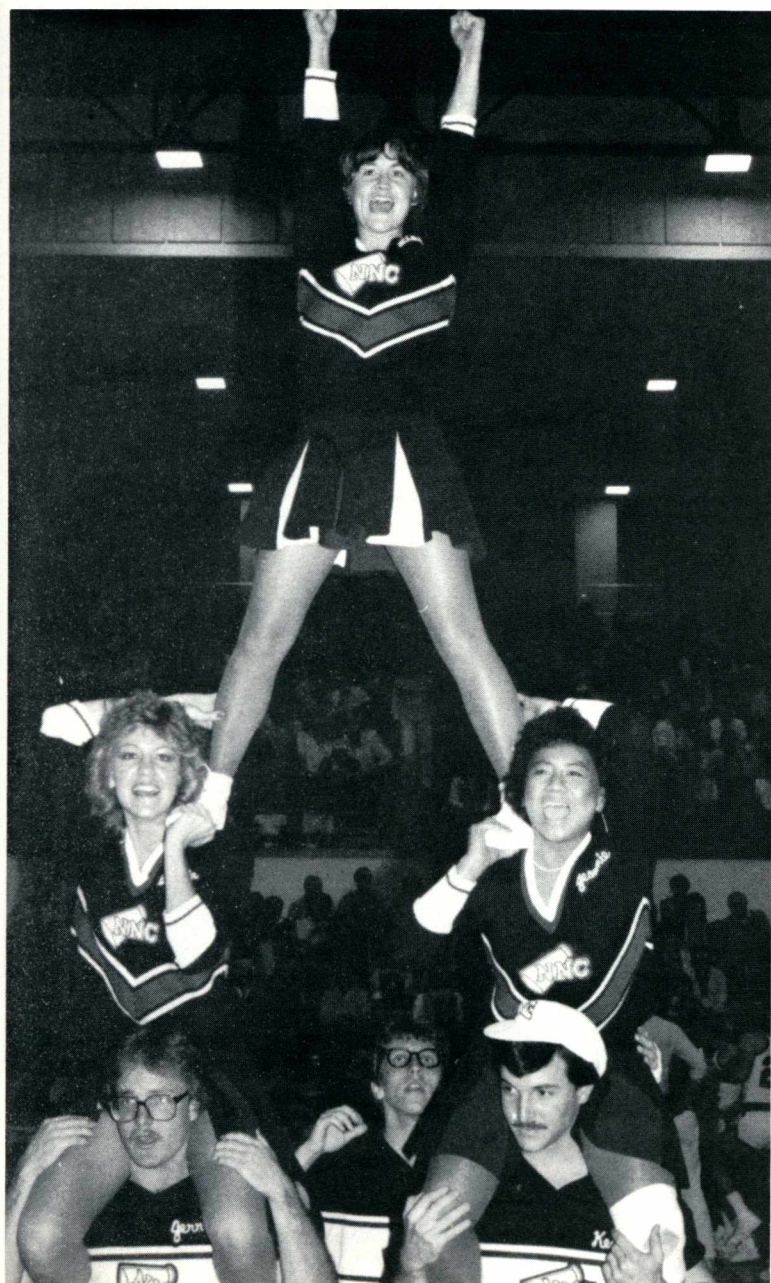
The Spirit Team

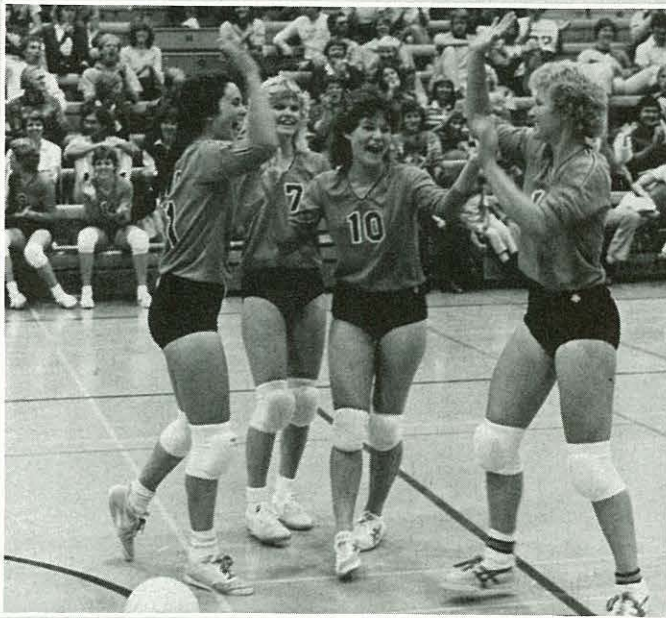


The Volleyball Season

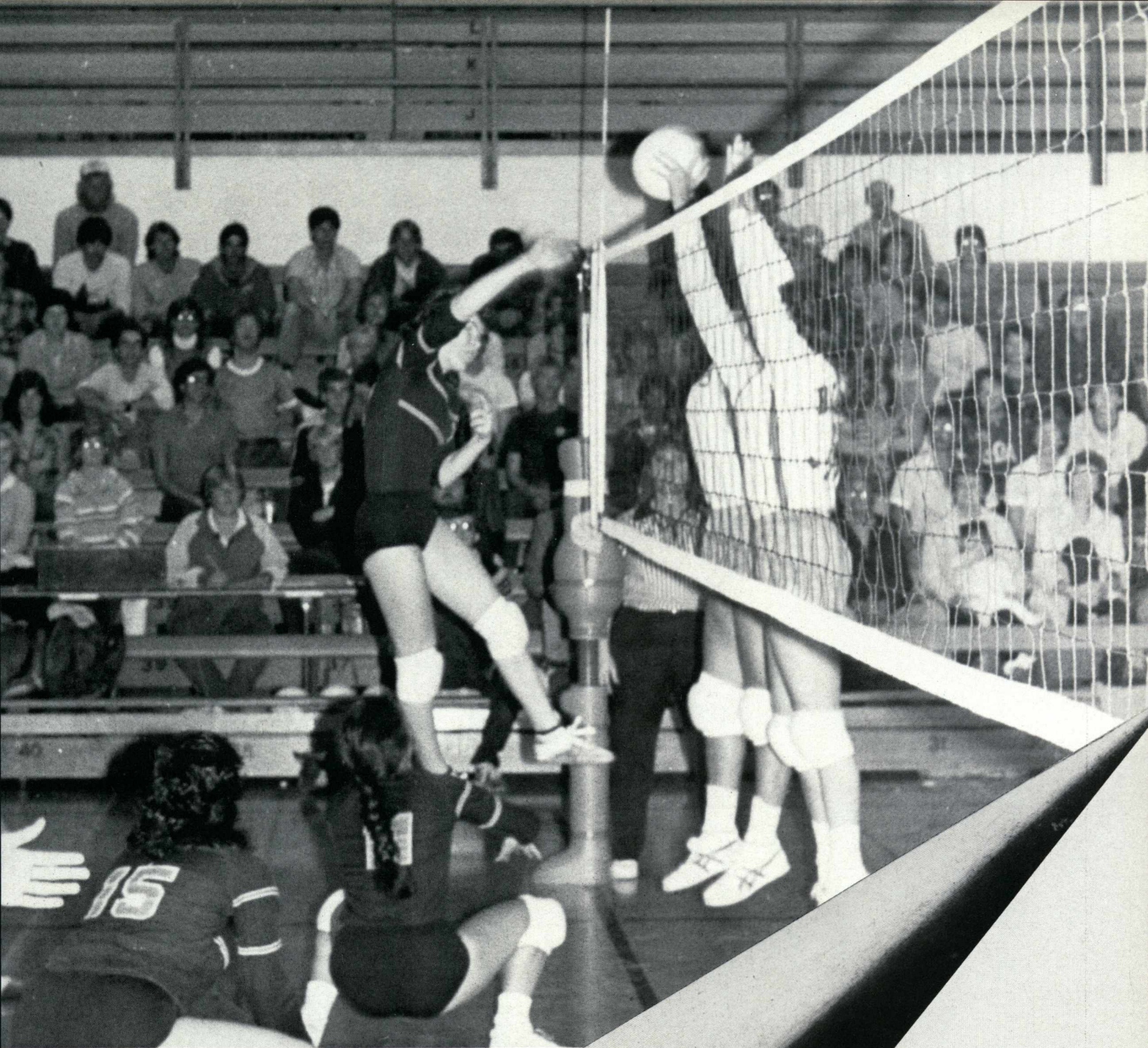
Forget the team record which was dismal with four wins and thirty-three losses. "I feel good because there was a lot of improvement," said head volleyball coach Mona Lewis.

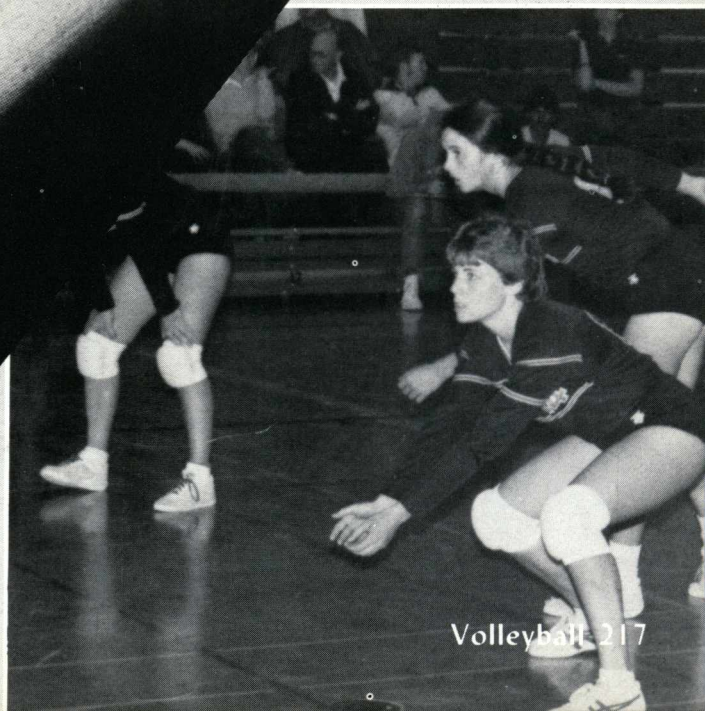

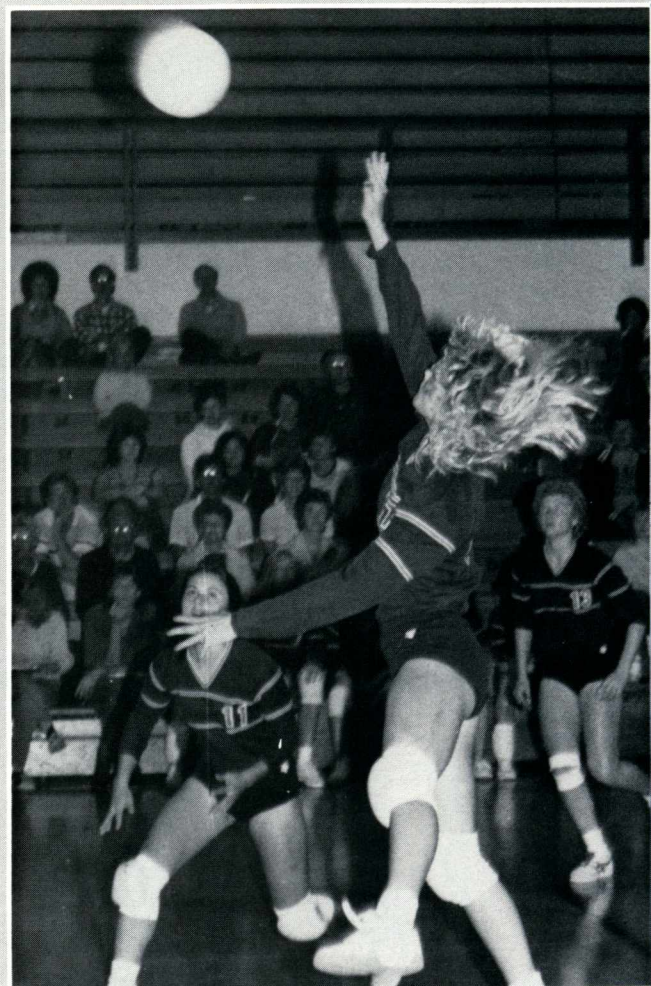

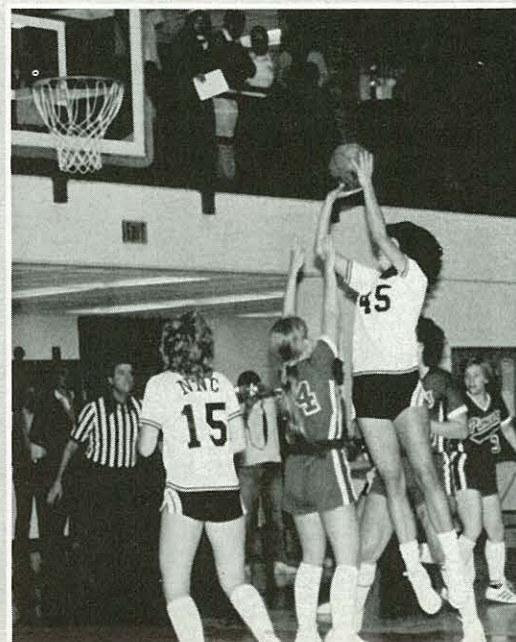
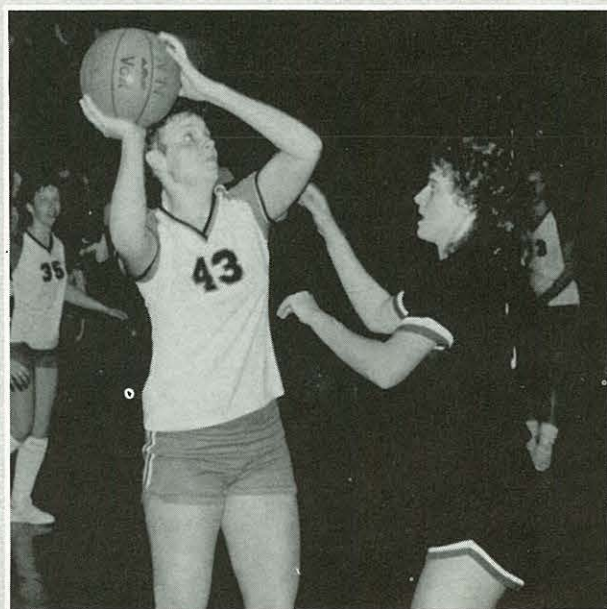
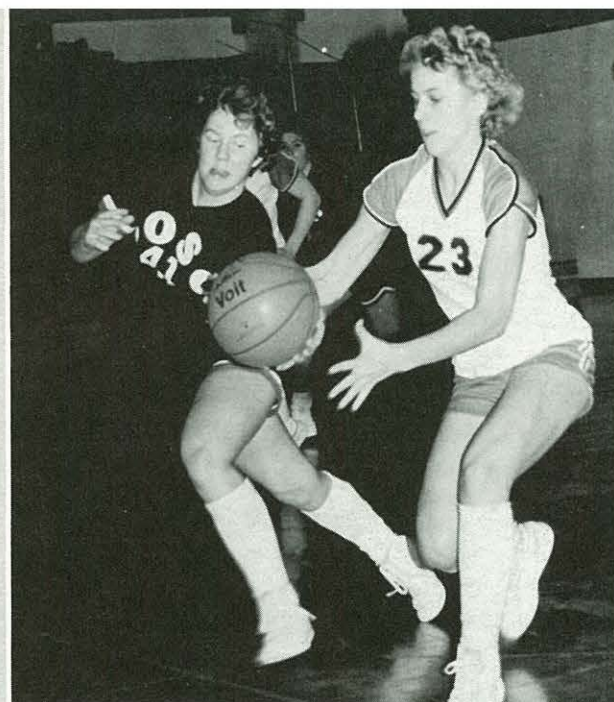


Women's Basketball

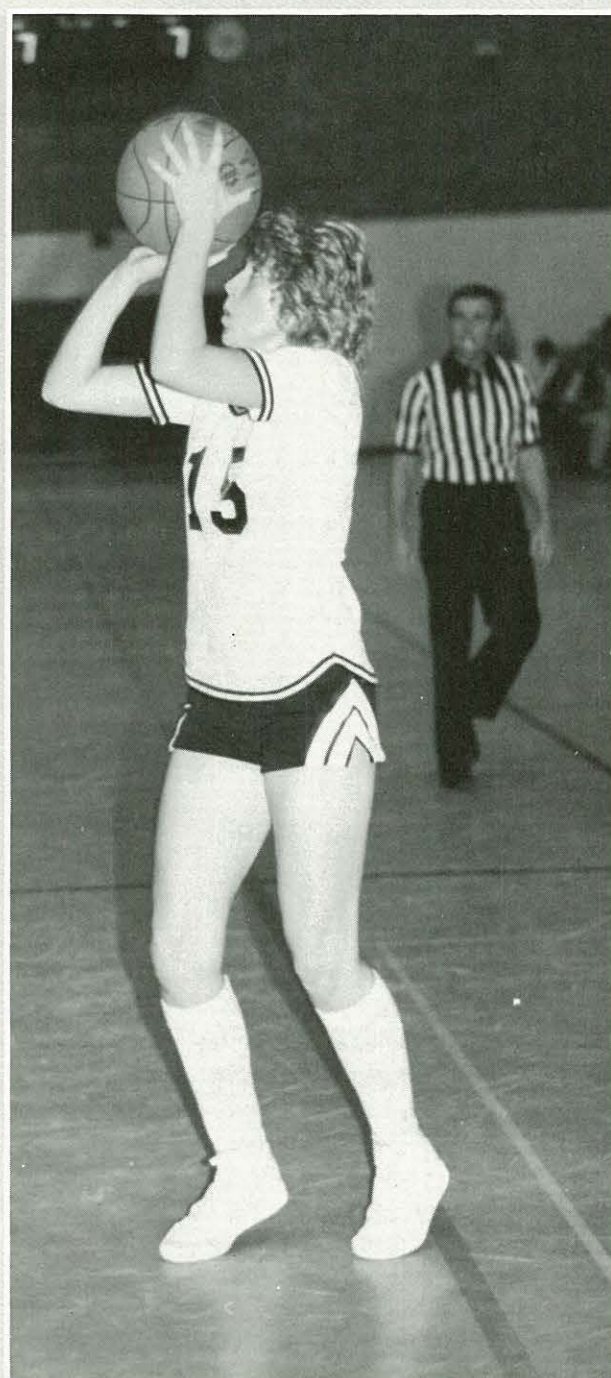
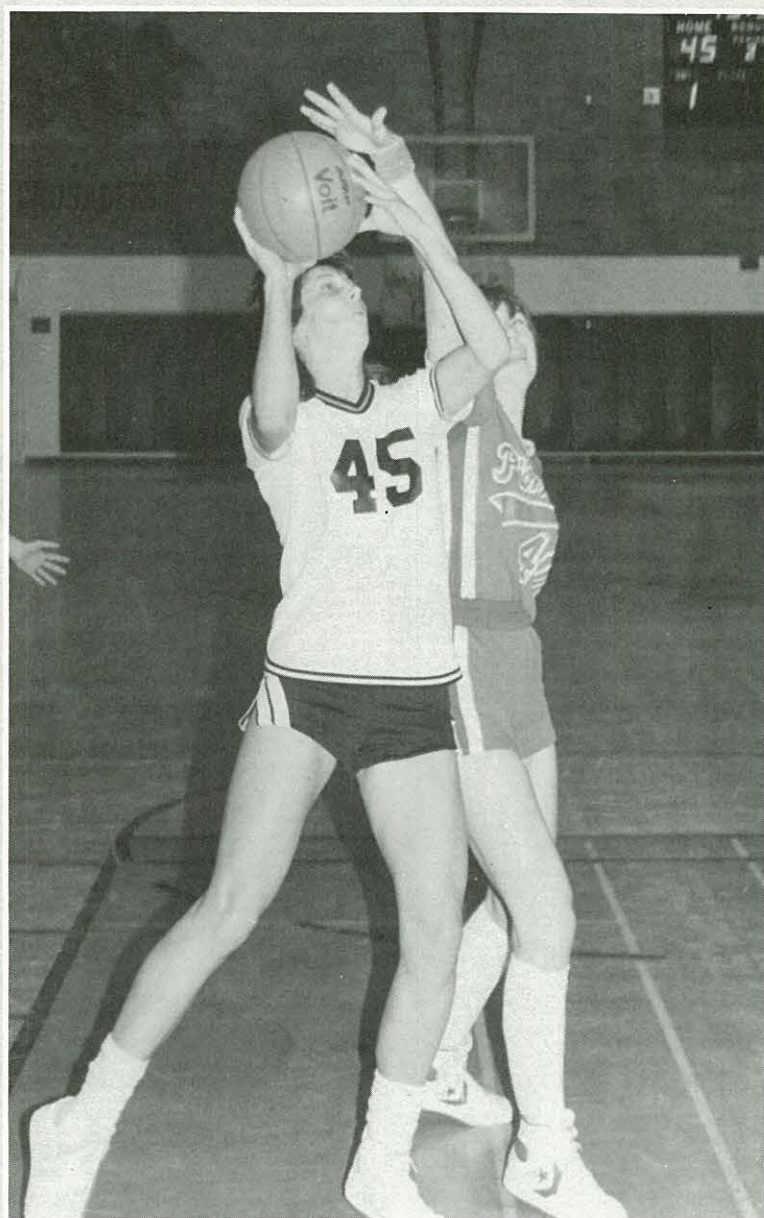

The Crusaders finished a perfect 10-0 at home knocking off the powerful cross-town rivals and district champions, College of Idaho, along the way.

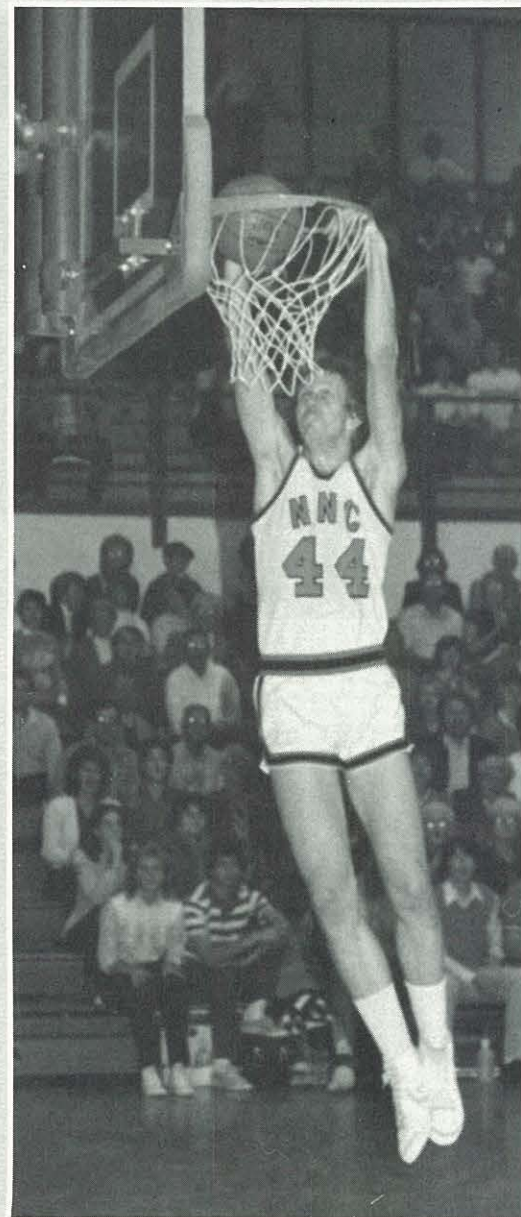
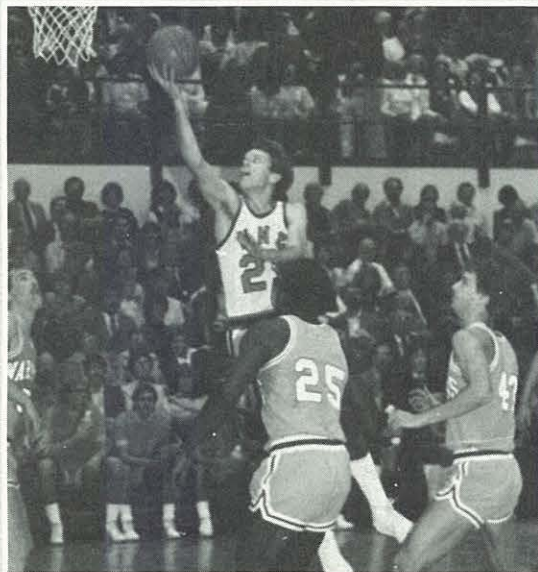
"I am very happy with the progress we made this year," noted head coach Gary Matlock.

"They both did a great job for us. I was pleased with their performances this year," said Matlock.

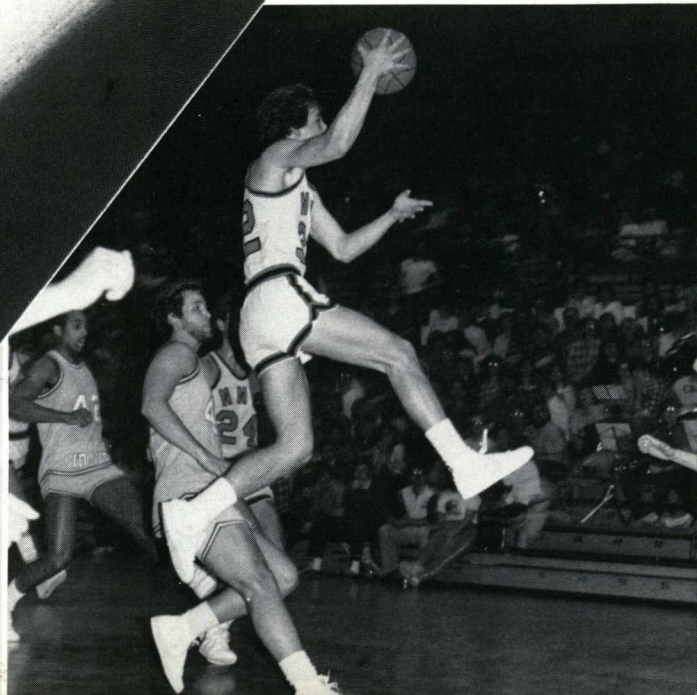
Tony Stone, a returning player was also a second-team All-District performer, and will quarterback the "84-'85 Crusaders to what looks to be a very promising season.

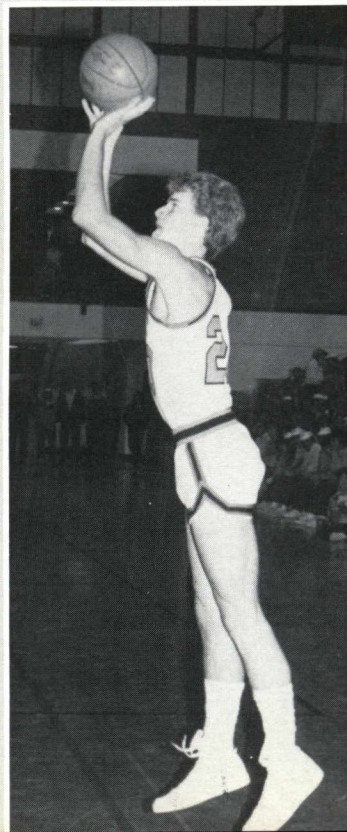
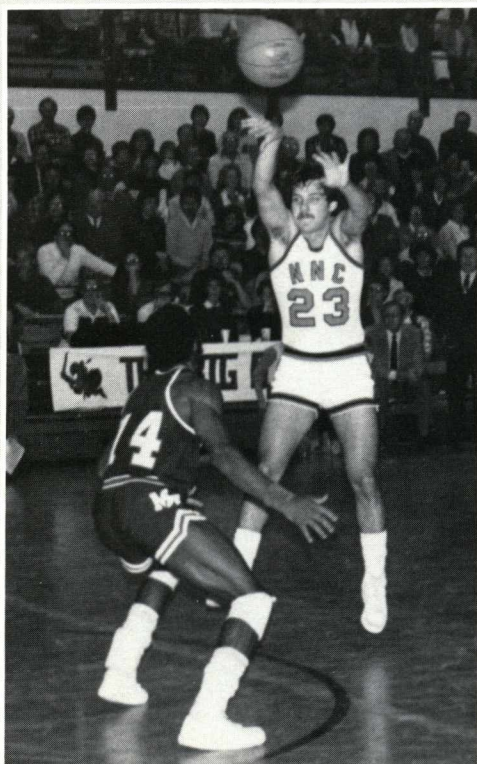
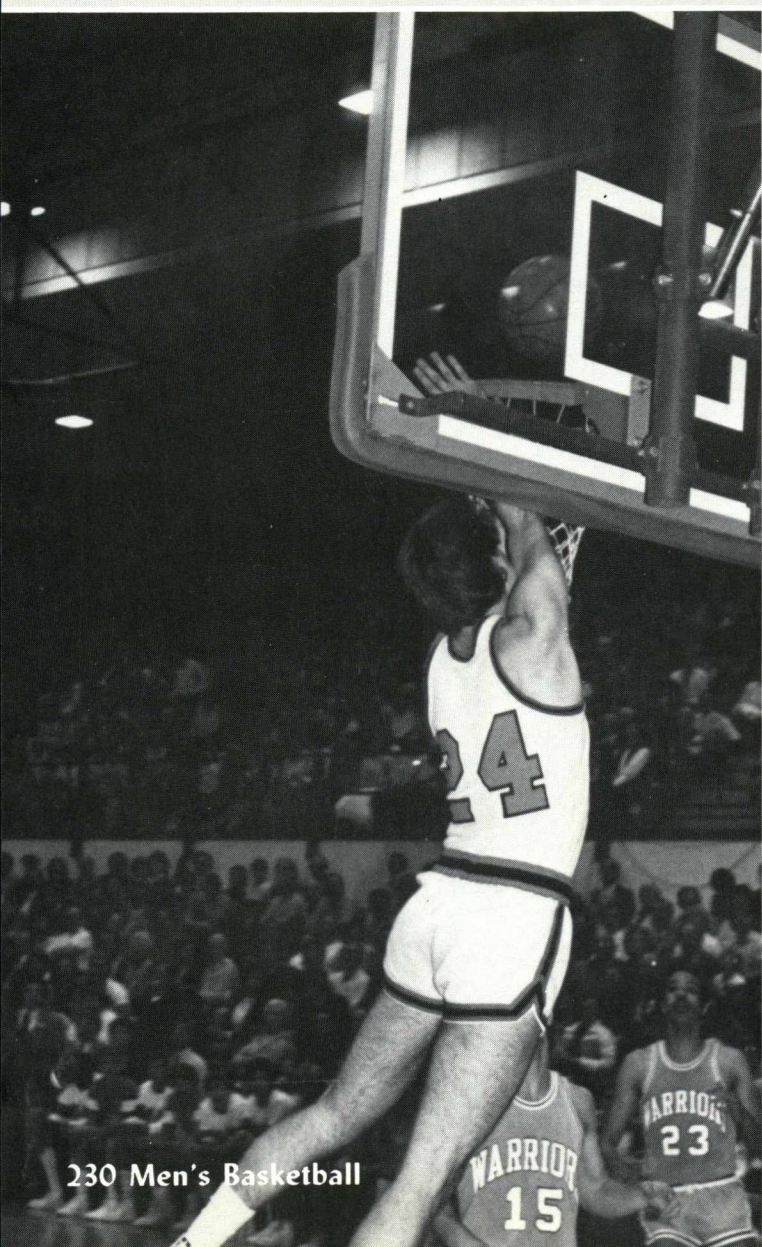
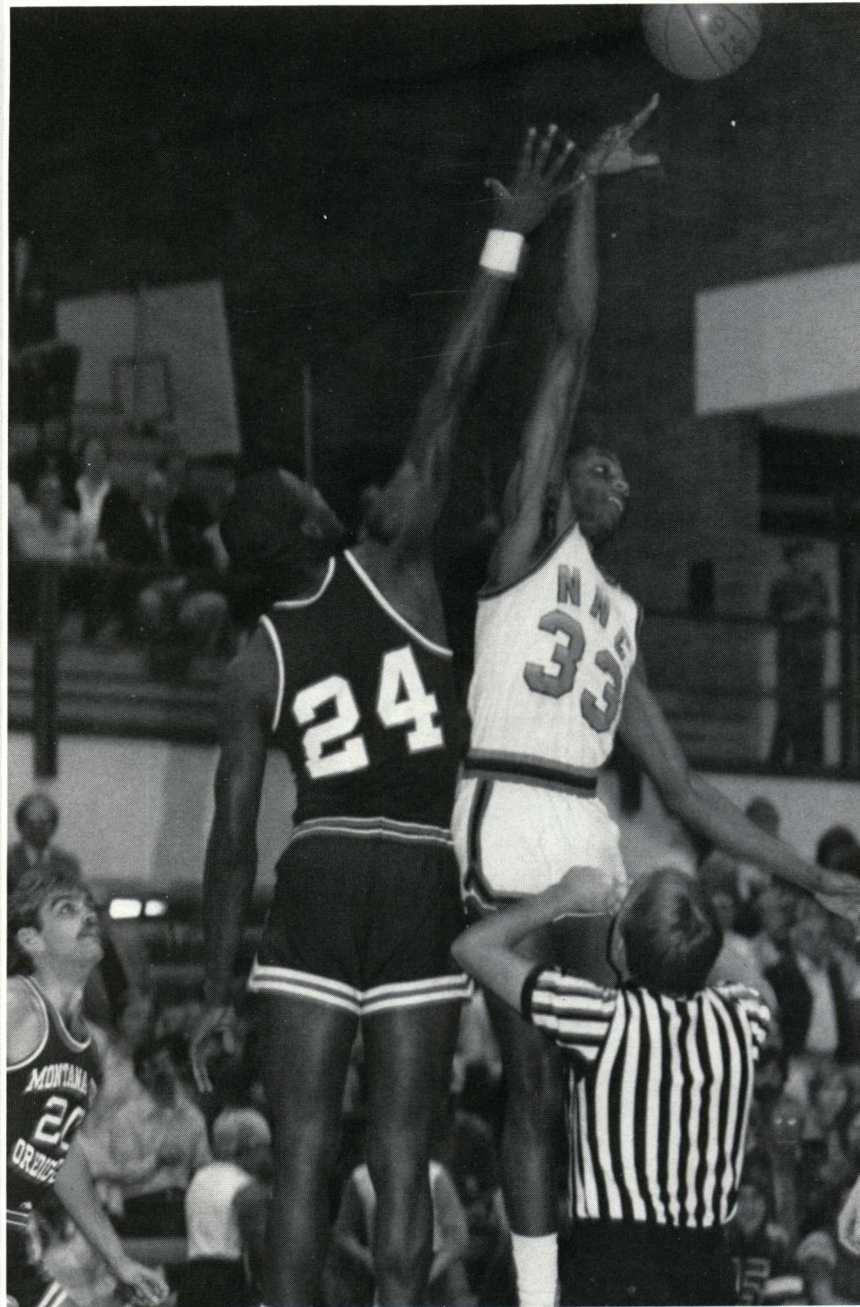
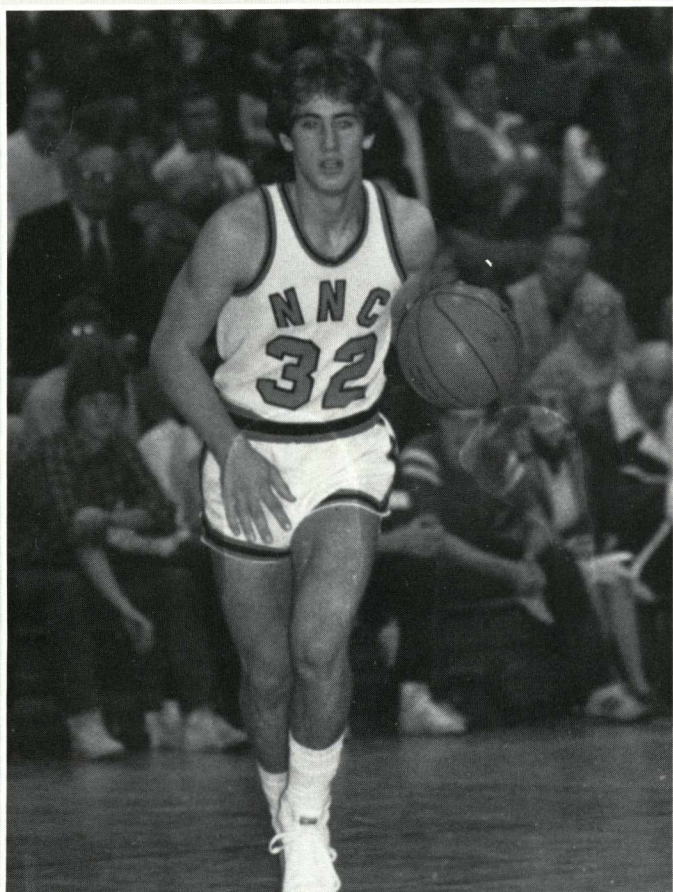
"If we play to our abilities next season, we should have a very successful year," said Matlock.





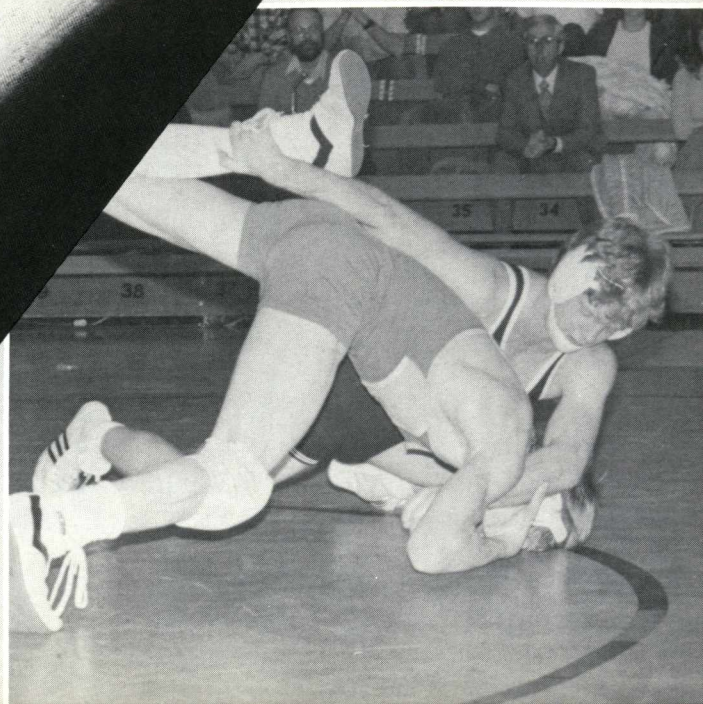

"We were coming on strong at the end of the season," said wrestling coach Darryl Wenner.

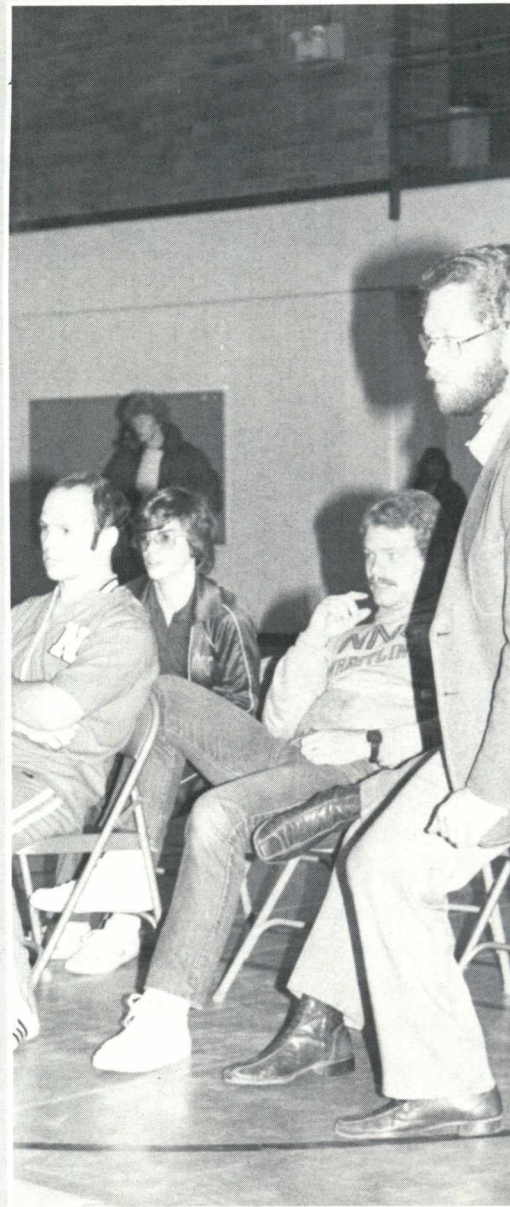
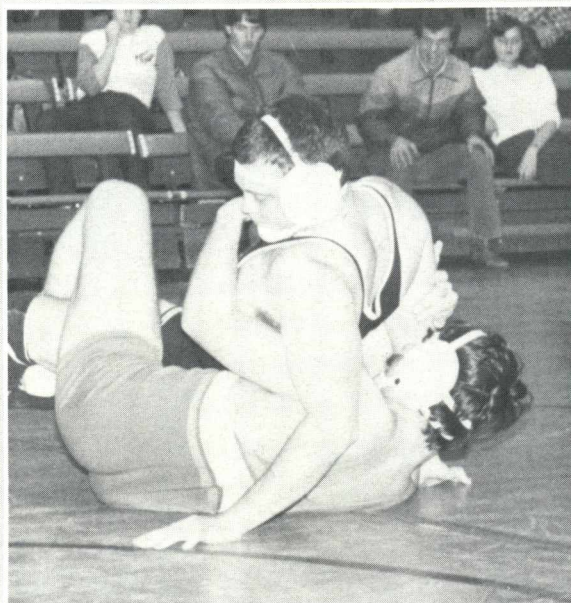
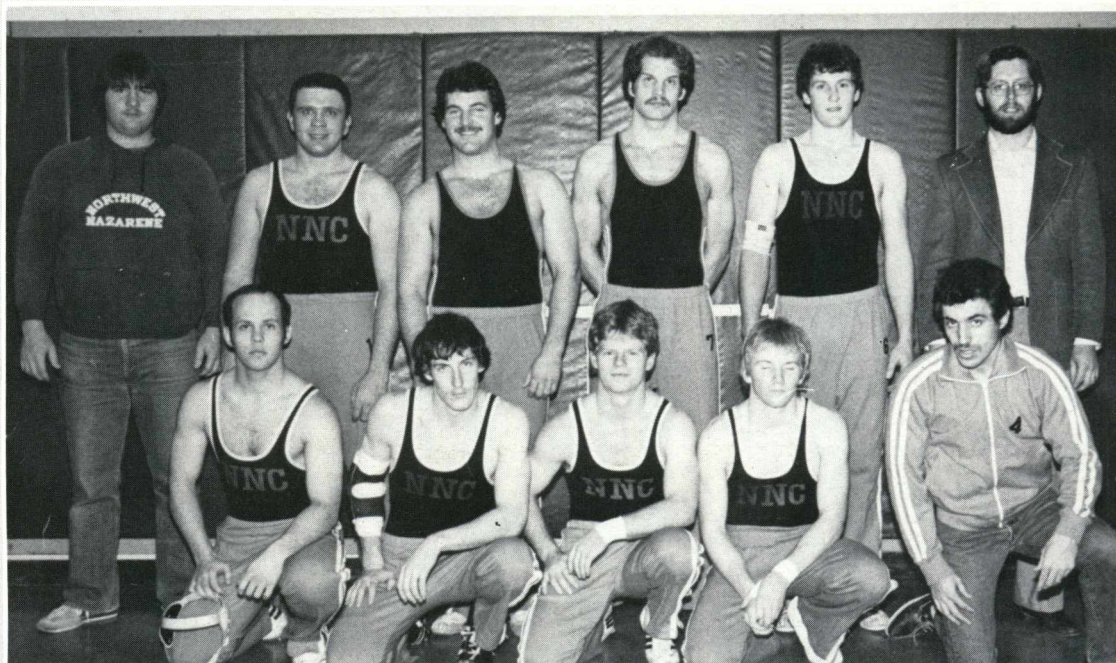

Wenner also had great expectations for upcoming '84-'85 season," We should be improved in overall strength, and there are several good prospects here in the valley which may attend NNC."





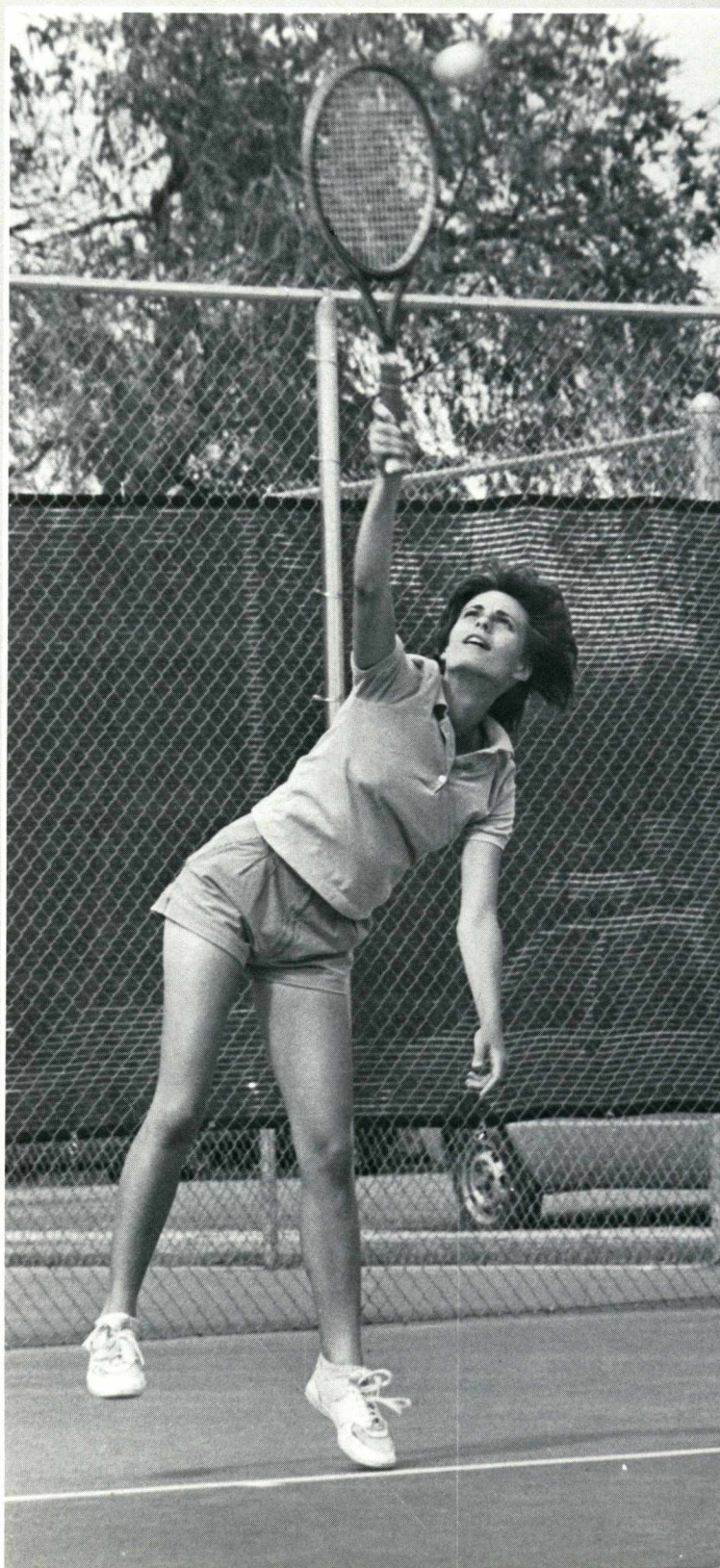
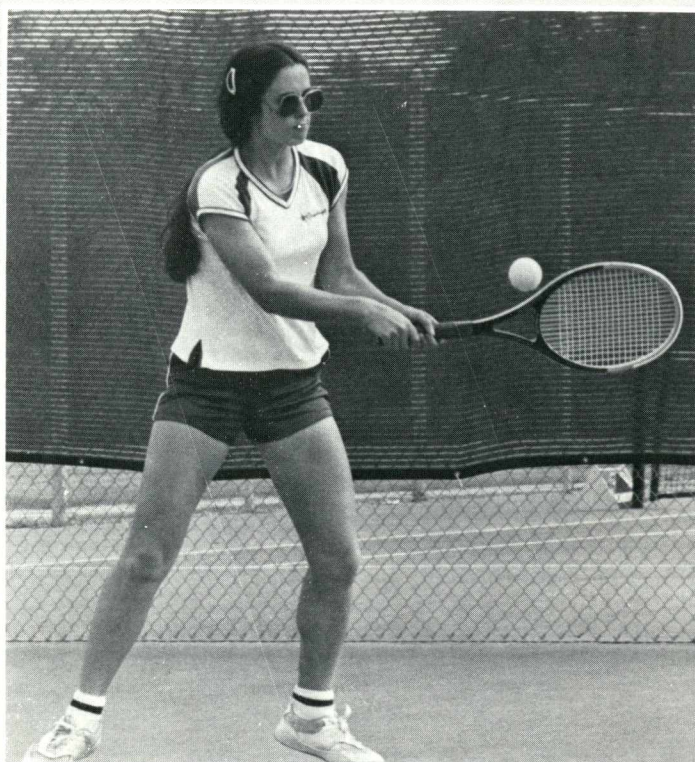
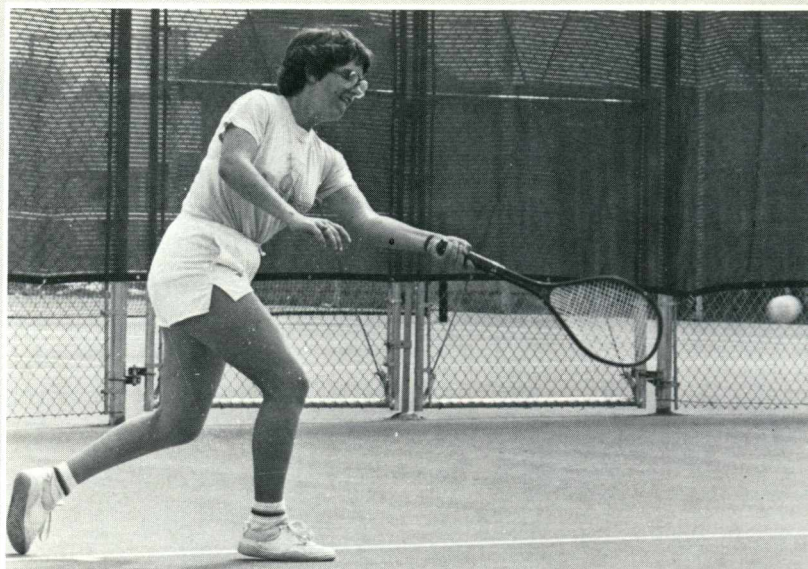

Womens Tennis

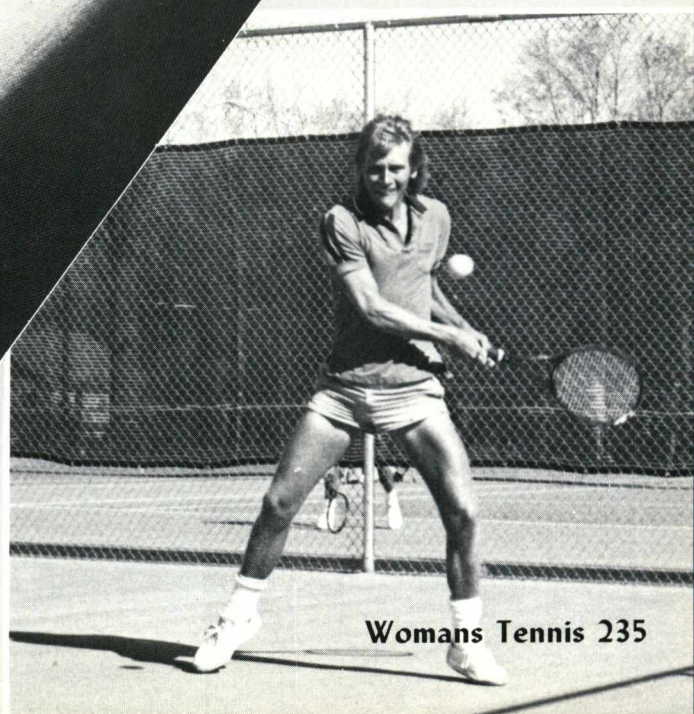

"Most valuable" players on the team were Mike Caven and Rob Warwick while Sacket was voted "Most improved" and received the Paul Swalm tennis award.

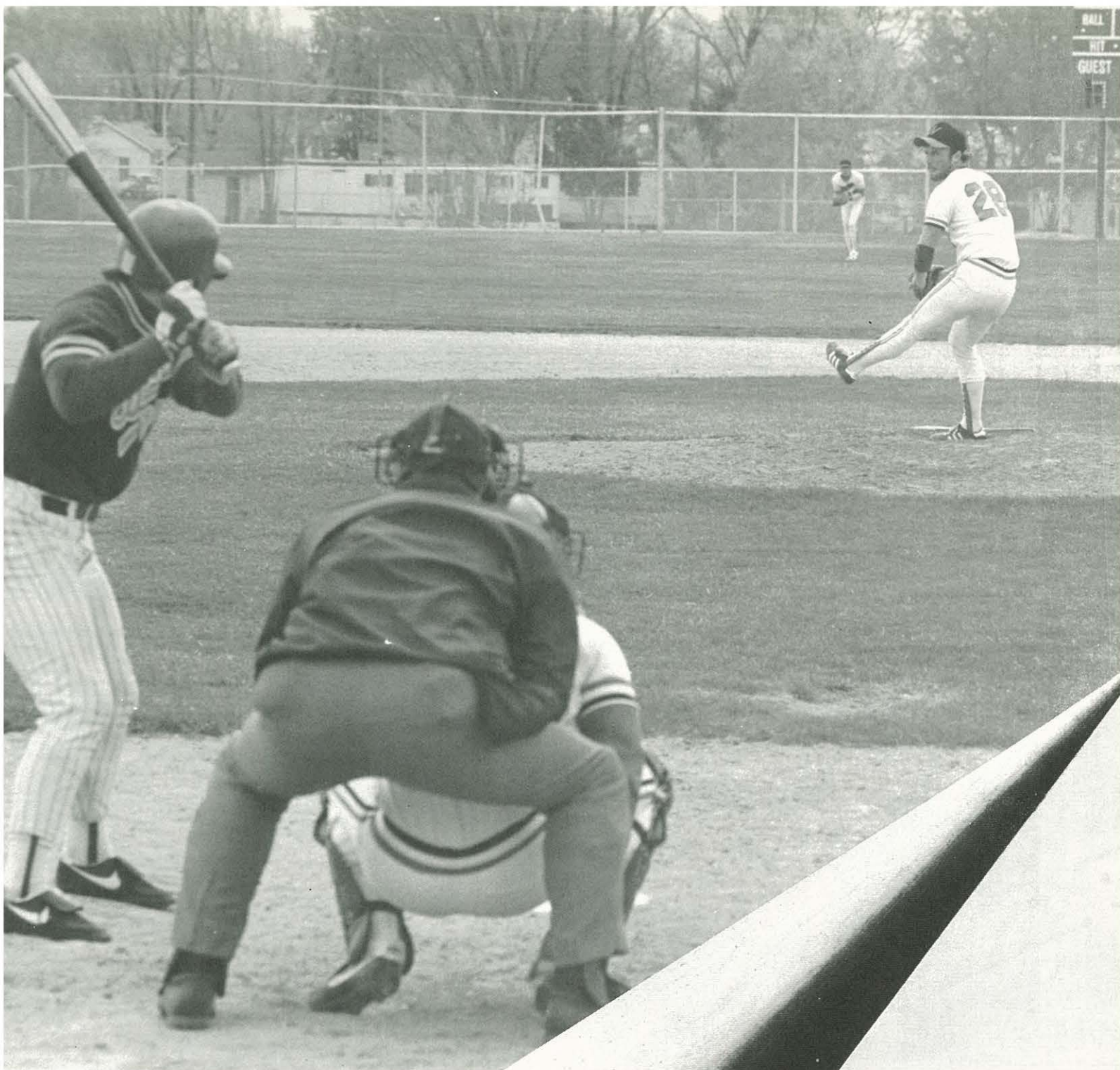

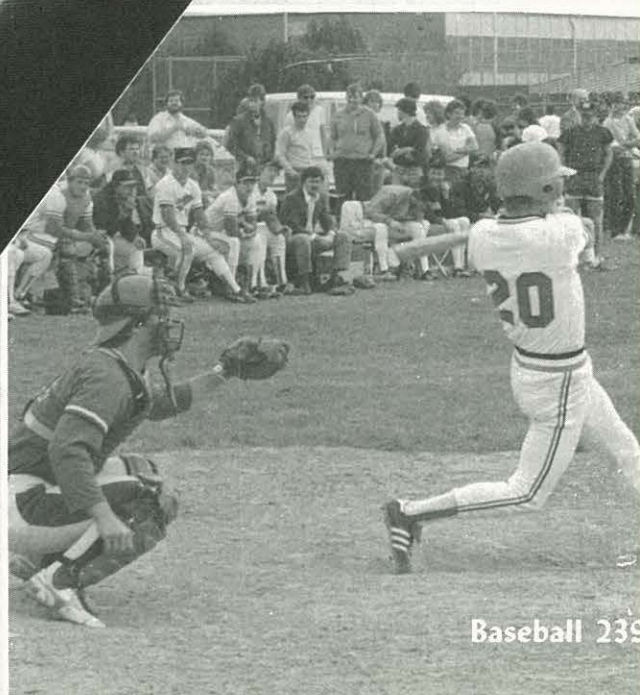
Coming off of a season in which the Crusaders finished only percentage points out of the play-offs, much was expected from this year's squad.

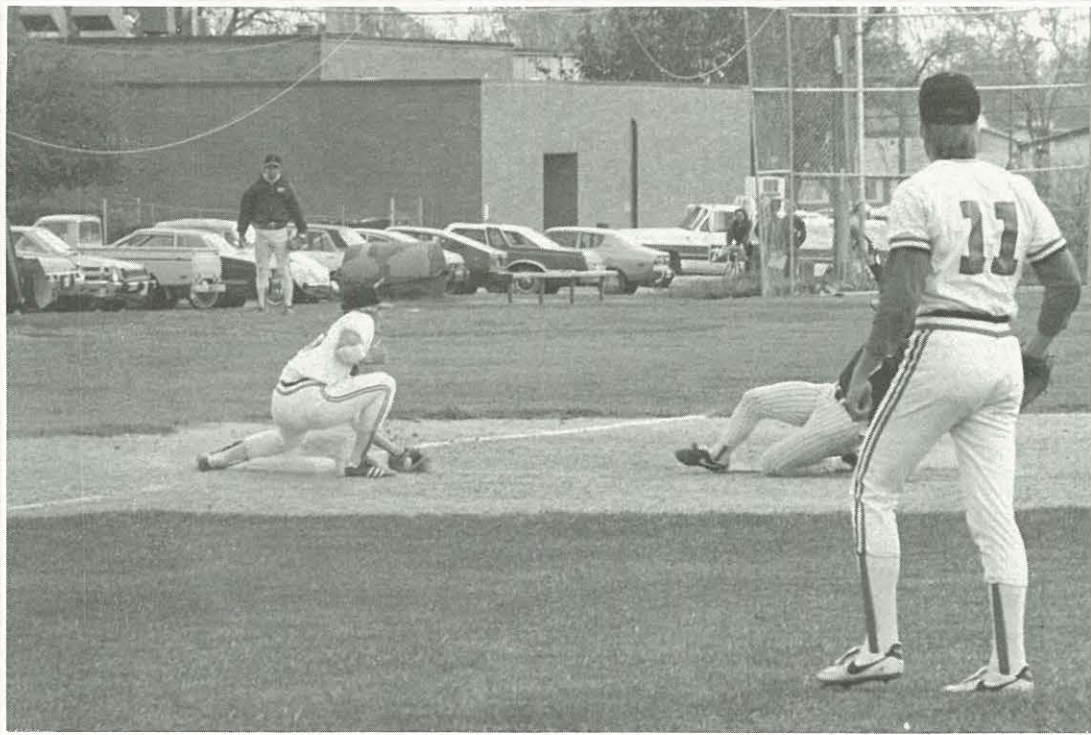
Key injuries to the pitching staff, which was very young to begin with, dashed many of those hopes for a competitive record and the squad finished a season mark below the .500 level.

As a team however, the Crusaders sparkled at the plate, rapping out a .313 team average. Leading the club in that area were Kevin Englehardt and Tim Miller who battled .370+. Seniors Dave Malpass, Ron Hezeltine, and Widd Medford also hit at or above the .300 level, as did freshman Chad Christensen who after taking over at third base midway through the season improved steadily at the bat to finish well above the .350 mark and added two home runs including a grand slam.

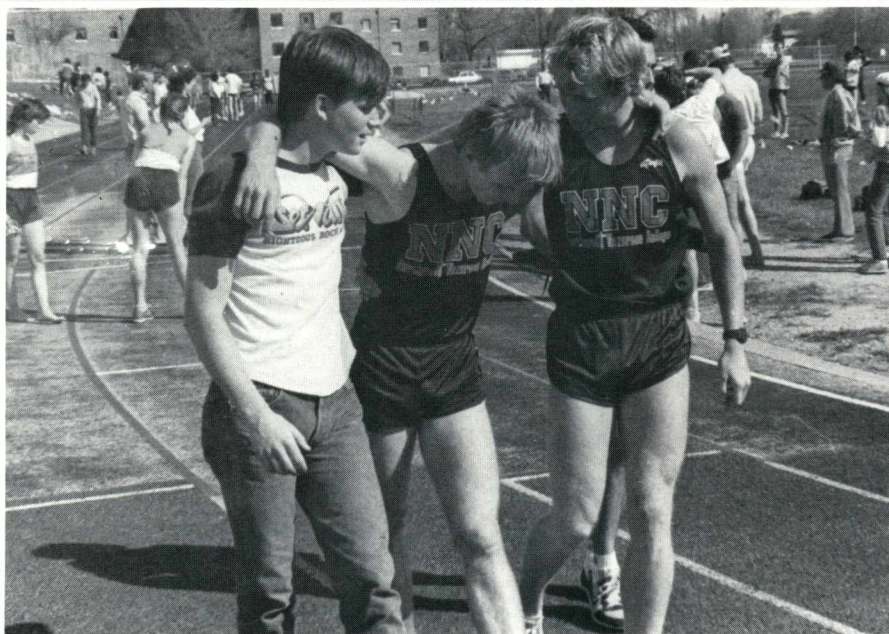

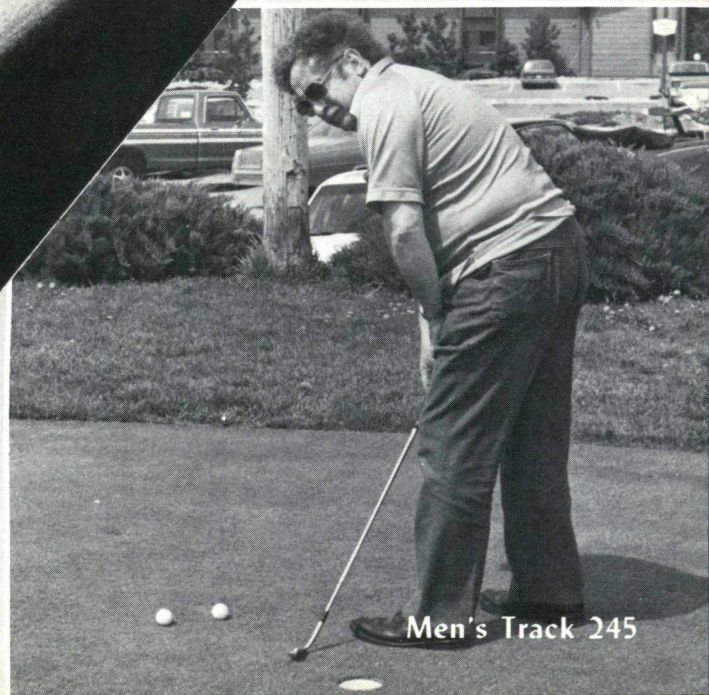




The men's track team may not have exactly set the sports world on its ear this year, but head coach Paul Taylor has much to look forward to next year.

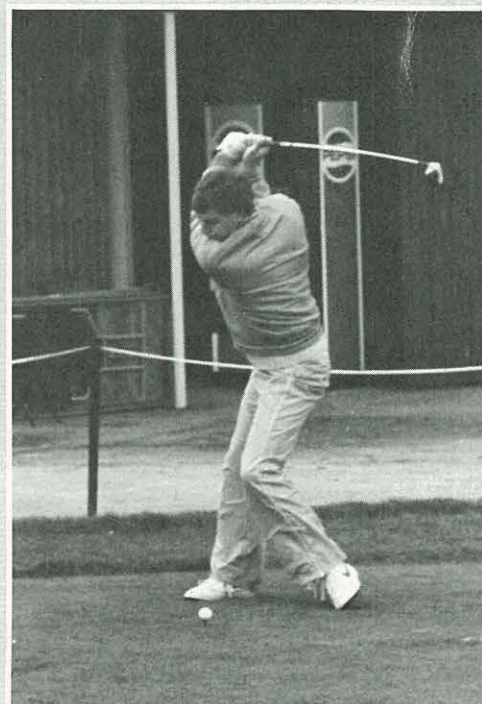
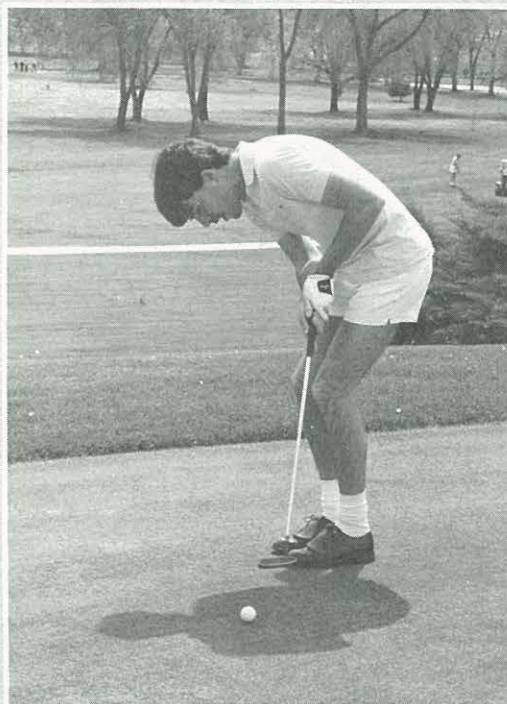
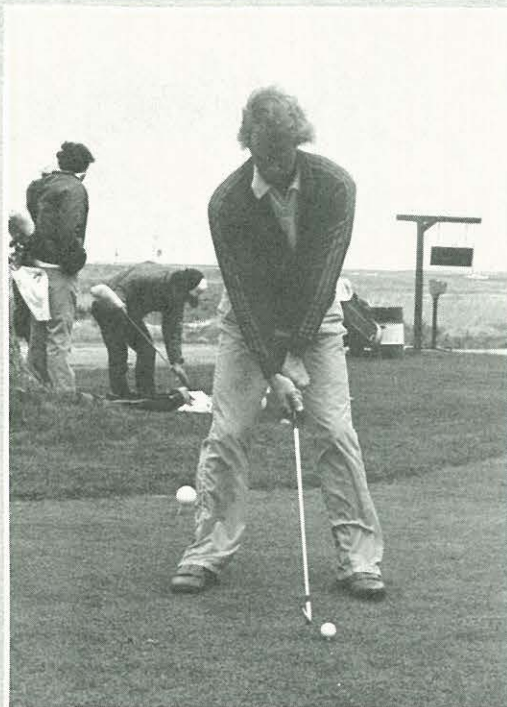

The women's powderpuff action starred MP's with five wins, followed by BB with three wins and team #4 with one win. The championship game score was MP's 6 - BB's 2.





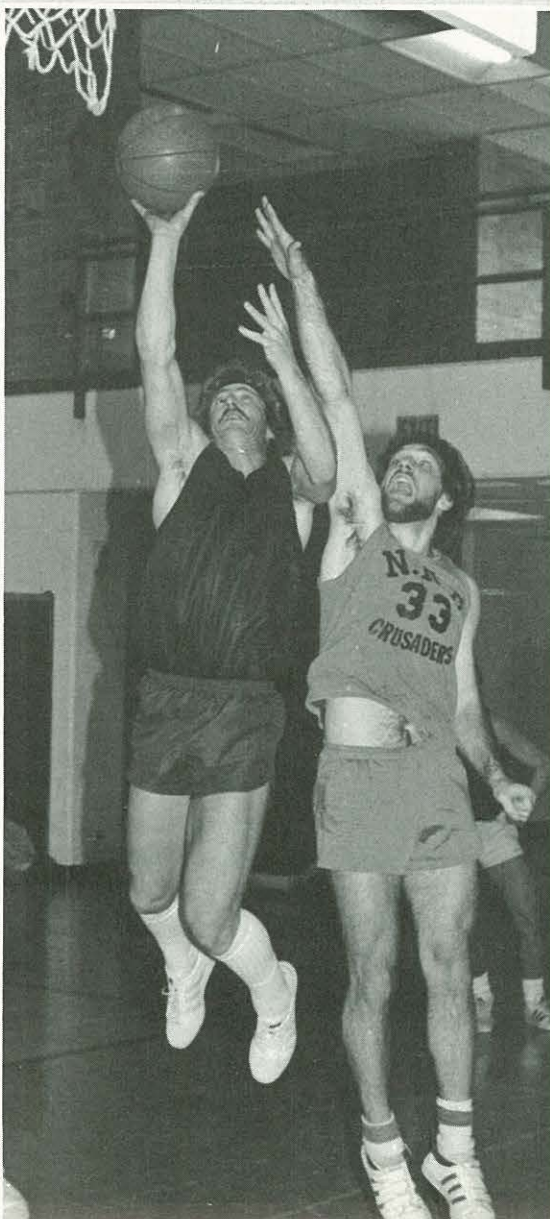
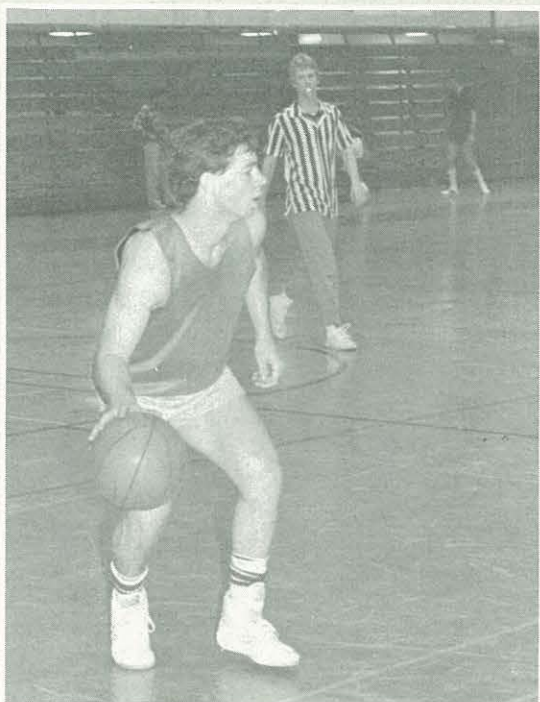
It may not be the Superbowl or the NBA championship, but it's still football or basketball, and the competition appears just as intense.

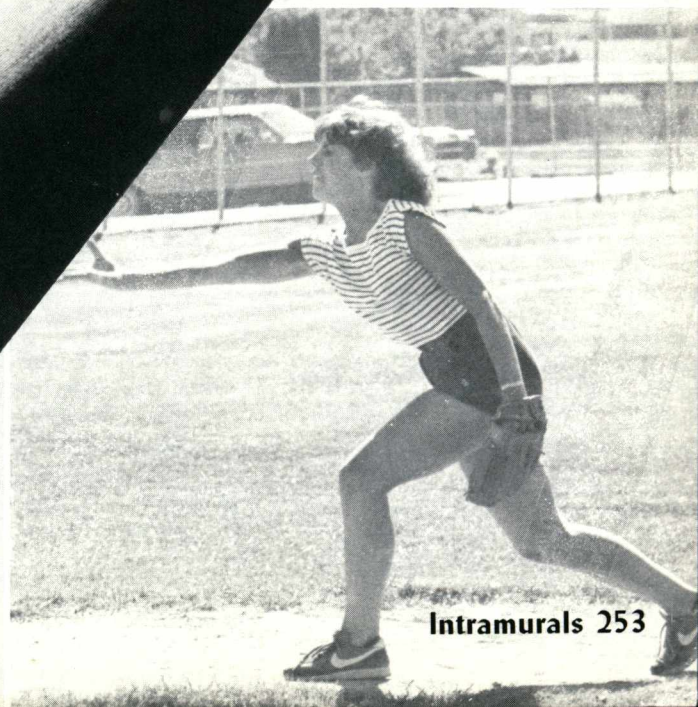




Forget who Mr. October is, bag the world series and get down to some serious softball, intramurally speaking.

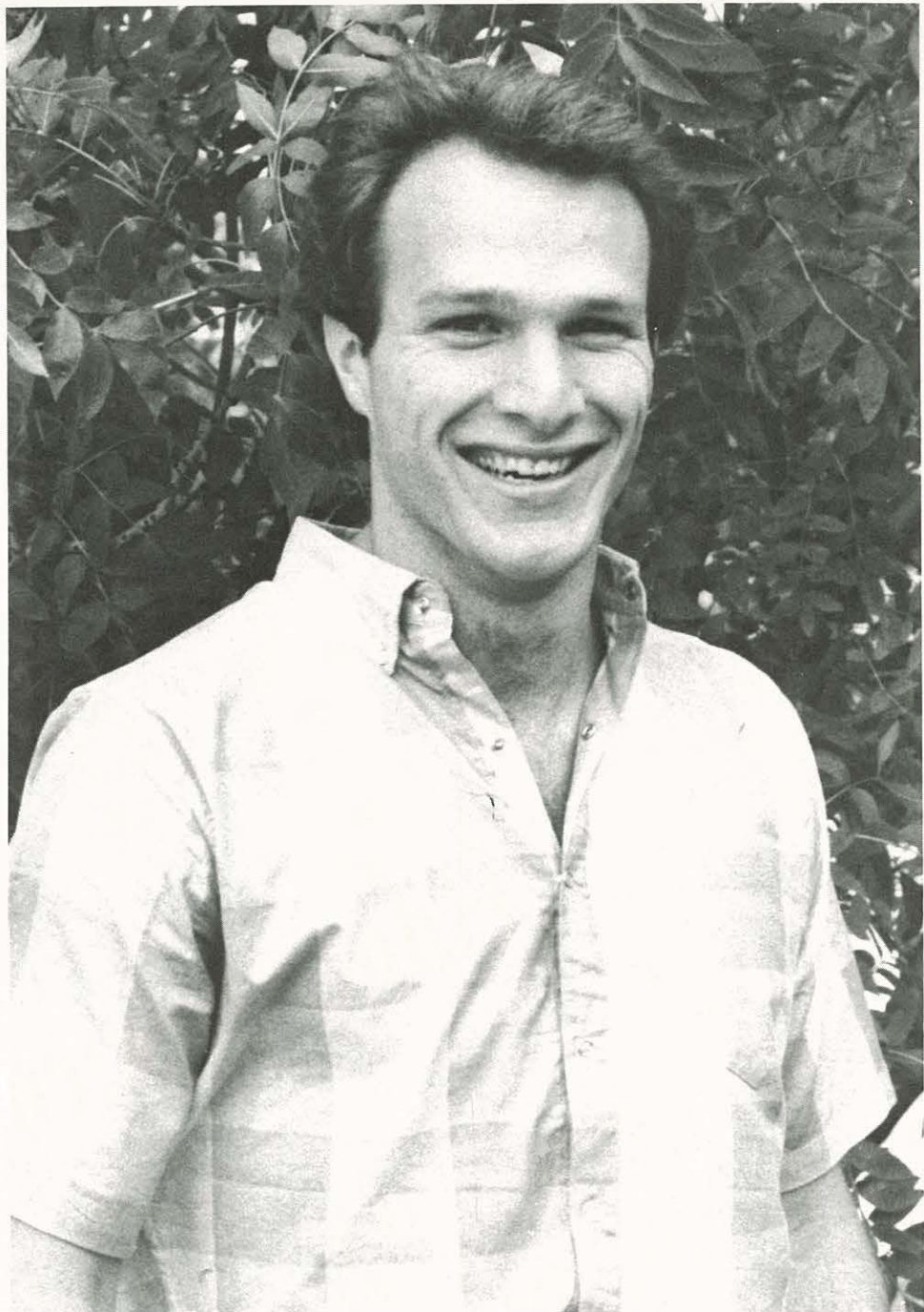

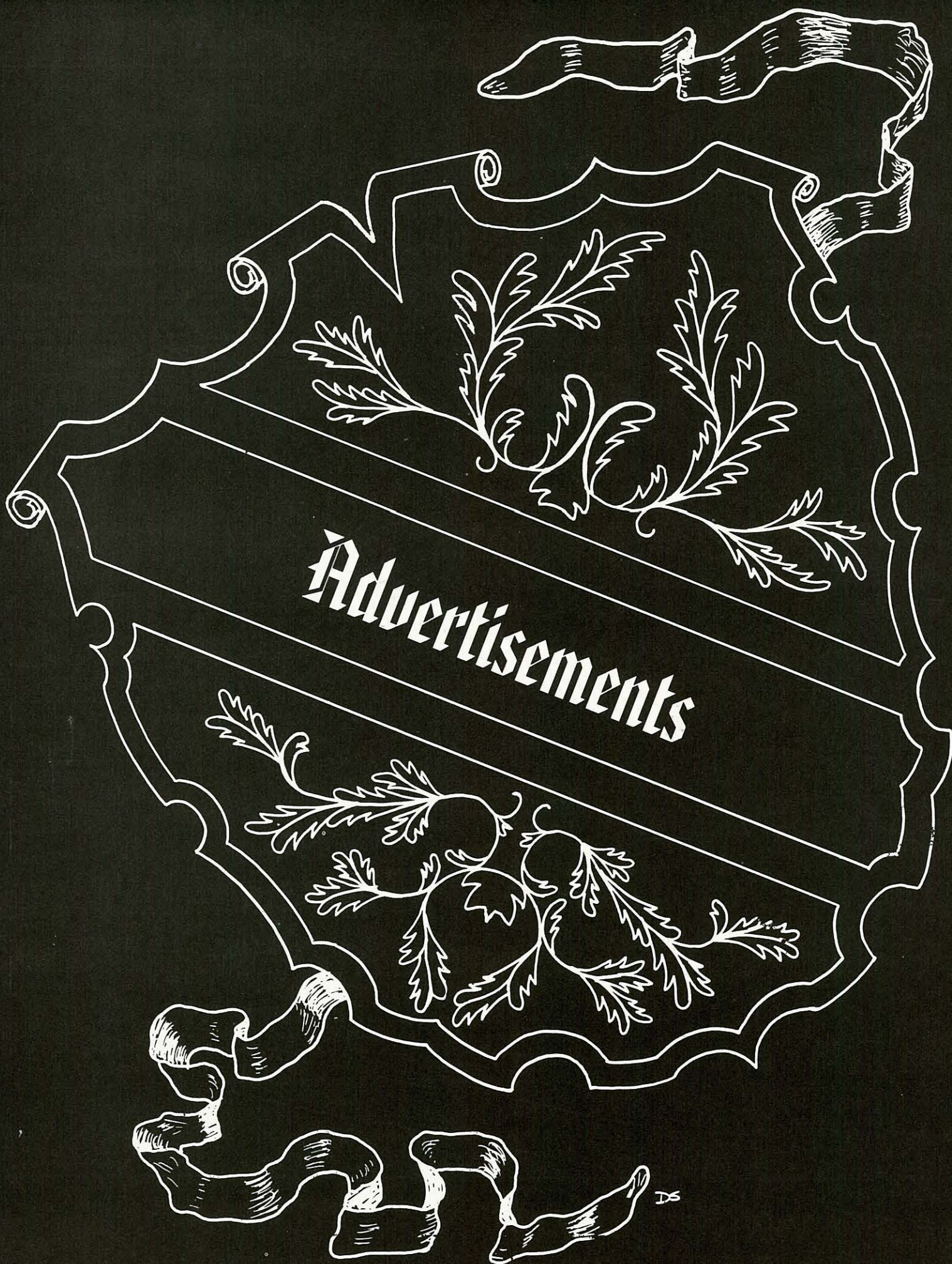
Orrin E. Hills Intercollegiate Award



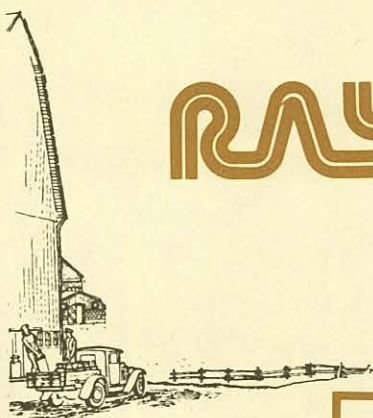

For those of you who have not taken up the sword though, where does your strength lie? Where is your protection? A world around you is slowly dying and there is but one hope. When will you heed that call?

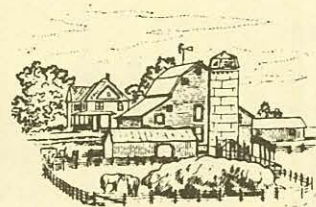
