



The voyage of 1947-48 at N.N.C. is past. We have weathered stormy seas, anchored in the calm, and experienced weeks of clear sailing.

To the parents of the students of N.N.C. we dedicate this book.





To Professor Roger Taylor goes the credit for training the choir and making it the success that it was.






College Church Building Program


