



Living to him was of greatest delight When a needy friend was there, For he loved all men and gave of himself From a heart that had grace to spare.


In eternal tomorrow when all will be known We shall see the good he has done, For his ready hands and willing feet Gave daily from the springs of his love.

Encircled soon about With asking, giving bands Of mortal ones who give And take of deep devotion's depth



The unwavering example and generosity of this year's student council has been an inspiration to all who are interested in the future well-being of Northwest Nazarene College.





In spite of the victories and fun of the past, the Juniors are ever looking forward, for soon they, too, will be the Seniors of Northwest Nazarene College.



In addition to these worthwhile features a diversity of topics—including current news, religious exhortations, and campus high lights —have been dispersed.





The Men's Club makes its first attempt to prove the superiority of the male of the species with the Beard-Growing Contest in the fall.


Under the capable leadership of Len Back this organization has undertaken several campus improvements, including the construction of the recreation arena between the Music and Speech Halls.







In addition to their other activities, the girls, have acted as usherettes and sold popcorn at the basketball games.




