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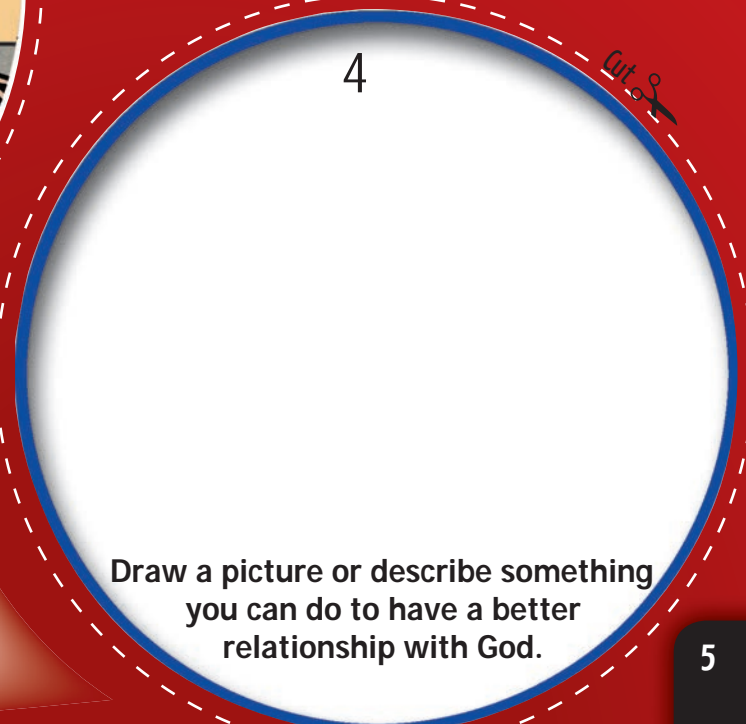
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The Most Important Thing for Jesus

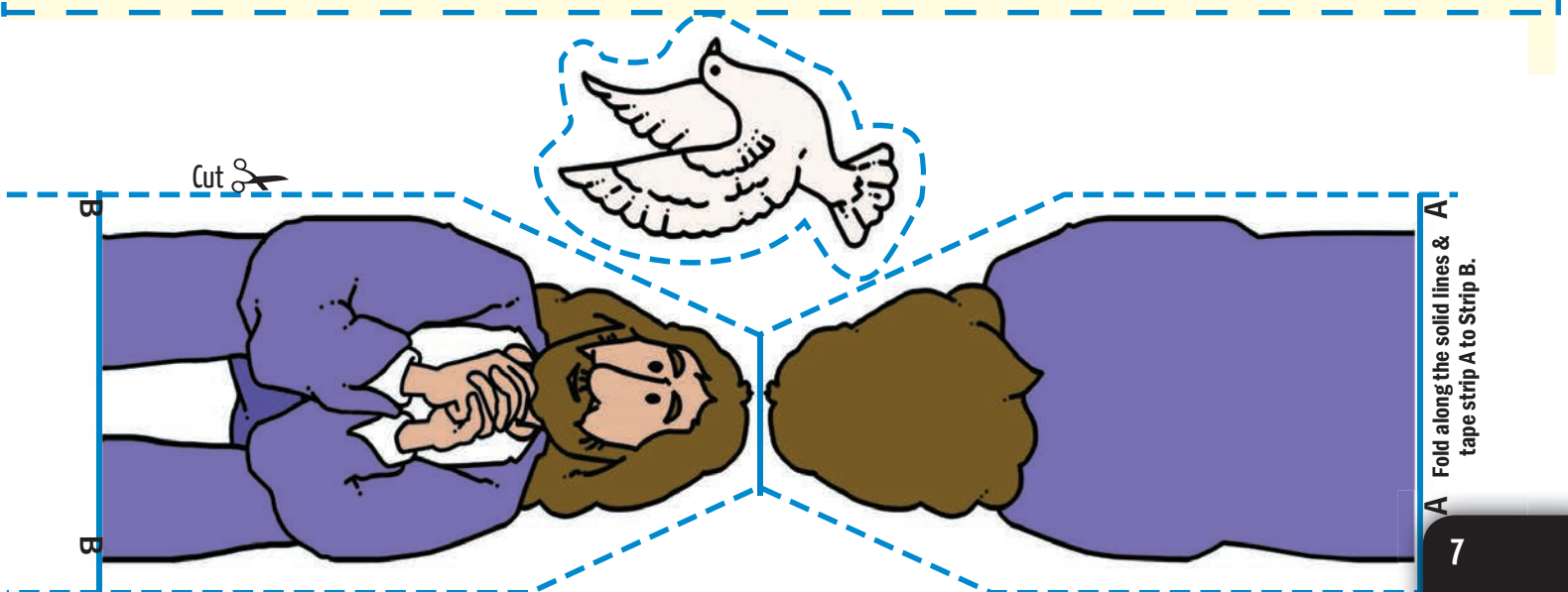


INSTRUCTIONS:

- 6. Change the pictures to see the different scenes.**

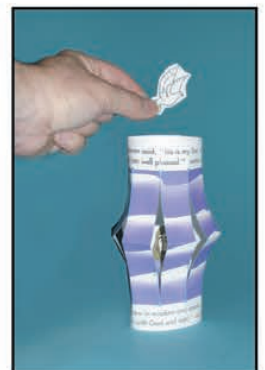

6. Place Jesus in the center of the water. Hold the dove with one hand. Use the water, Jesus and the dove to tell the Bible story.

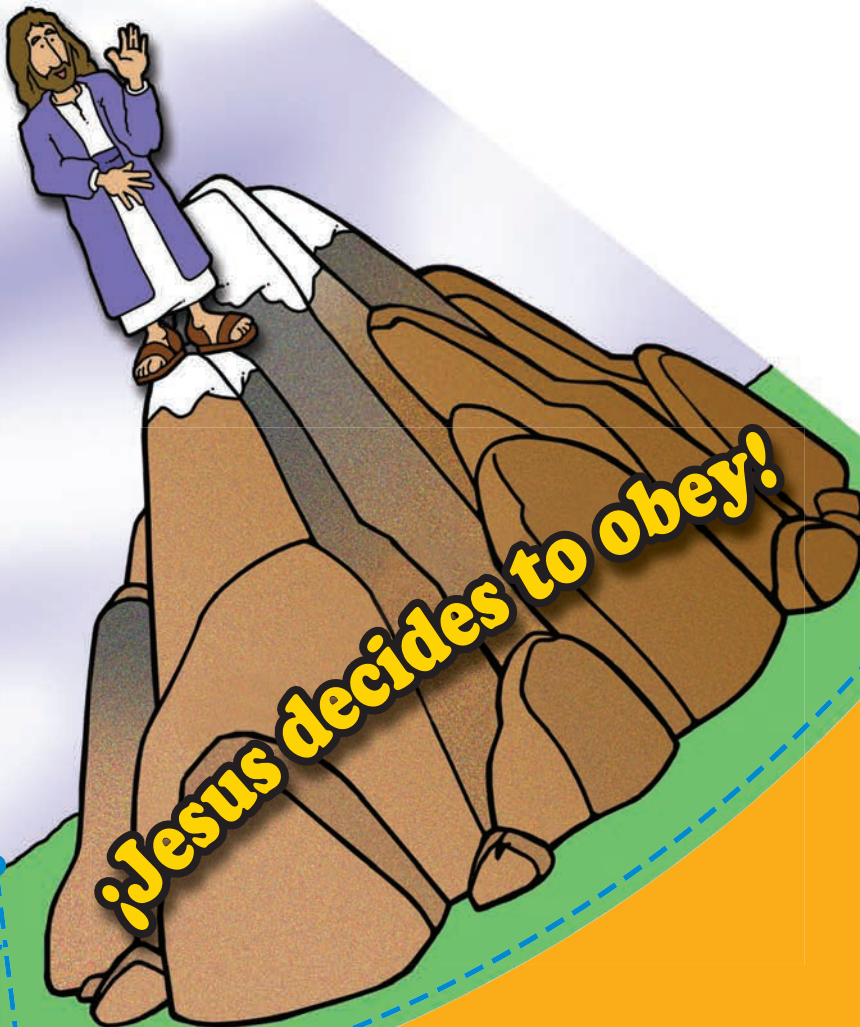

INSTRUCTIONS to make a mobile with the 10 Commandments:

You will need:

- Tablets 9 and 10 of the 10 Commandments from Cutout Section 2 (CS 2 D and E)
- Scissors
- Cardboard/heavy paper
- Hole Punch
- Glue or tape
- 10 pieces of string/yarn, 30 cm. each
- 2 piece of string/yarn, 84 cm. each
- Double-sided adhesive tape or glue stick.

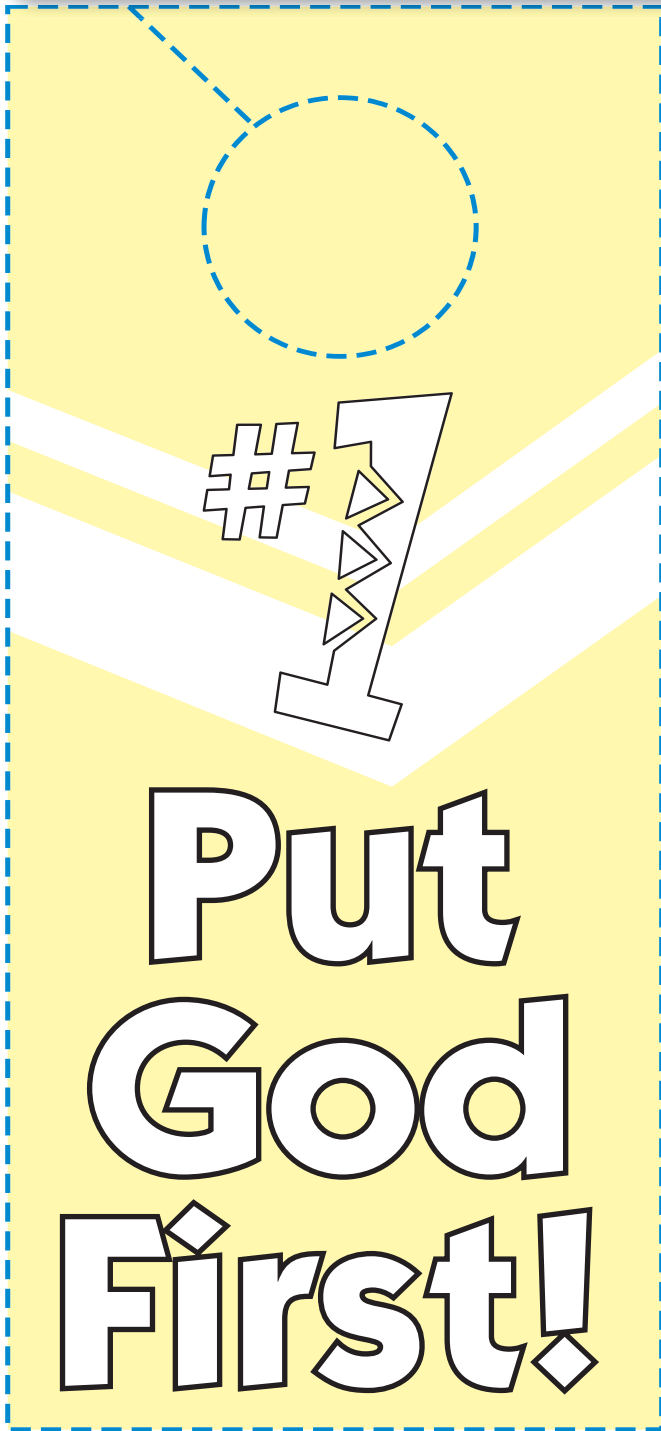
How to make it:

1. Cut out the two strips of the Bible verse and all of the 10 commandment tablets along the dotted lines.
2. Glue the Bible verse strips onto cardboard and set aside to dry.
3. Fold the tablets along the solid lines.

Continued on back

4. **Glue side A of the first strip of the verse with the side A of the second strip, and do the same with the side B's.**
5. **Punch holes through all of the white circles on the strips. Use the 10 pieces of string and put one through each hole.**
6. **Use double-sided adhesive tape, glue or glue sticks to attach the tablets to the ends of the string. Make sure the tablets are in order throughout the mobile.**
7. **Punch out the 4 holes in the top of the strips. Put a piece of long string in two of the opposing holes and tie them together. Do the same with the other two holes and the other piece of string.**
8. **Tie a knot at the top to hang up the mobile.**
9. **Use this mobile to remember the rules God has given us to live by.**



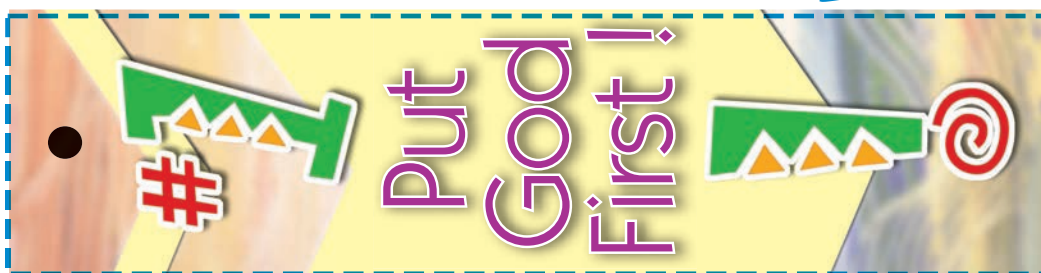

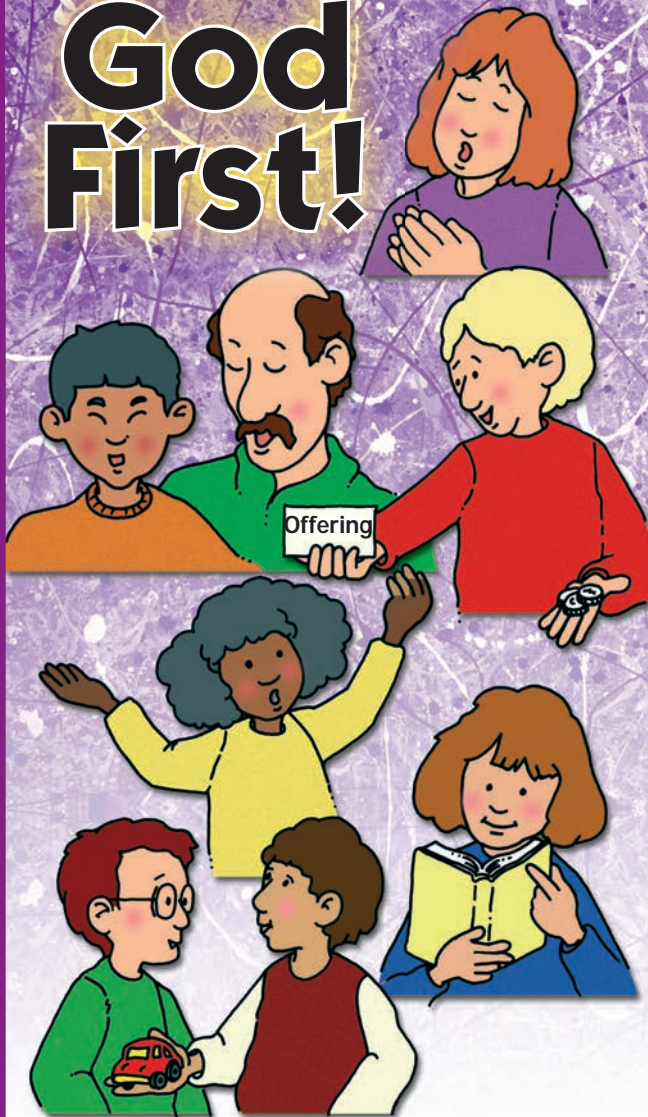

INSTRUCTIONS:

2. **Color and decorate the door hanger. When you finish, cover it with transparent contact paper.**
3. Cover the bookmark with transparent contact paper or wide transparent adhesive tape and punch out the circle at the top. Put a ribbon or yarn through the hole. Your teacher can help you.
4. Cover the mini poster with transparent contact paper. Glue it onto a piece of colored paper or make a frame (10 x 15 cm.) for it.
5. When you're done with steps 1-4, stick a magnet on these instructions. Turn them over and you will see what the 10 Commandments are. Put this on your fridge to help you remember.

THE ROADWAY TO THE TEN COMMANDMENTS

PREPARE TO PLAY: Cut out the circle and glue it to cardboard to give it strength. Create a spinner by placing a paper clip in the center and then attach it to the wheel with a two-legged paper fastener. The paper clip should rotate. Then cut out the tablets numbered 1 to 4. Glue them together with the numbers facing out. Your students can play in groups of four. Each player can choose a number as their place holder as they advance along the path.

How To Play

1. Spin the paper clip. Follow the directions on the wheel.
2. If you land in a space with a number, say that commandment (e.g., if you land on # 1, quote the 1st commandment, and so on). Advance 3 spaces.
3. If you land in a space that tells about a good act, advance 2 spaces.
4. If you land on a space that tells about a bad act, go back 2 spaces.
5. The first one to get to the end of the path wins.

INSTRUCTIONS for making your Bouquet of Contentment

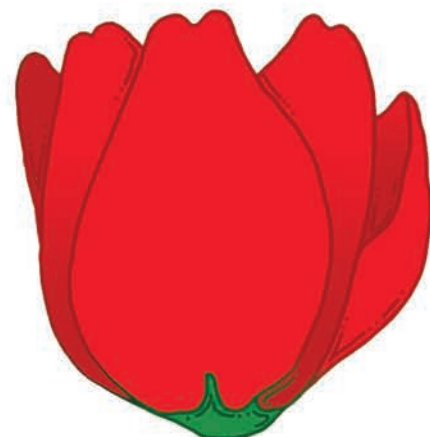
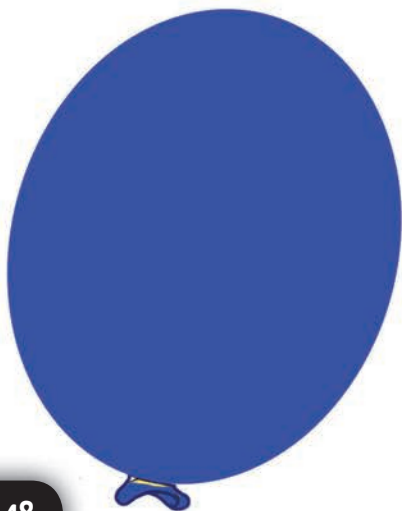
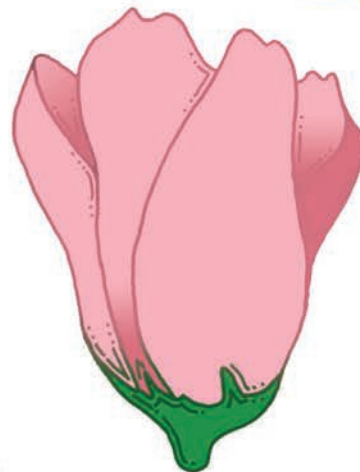


YOU WILL NEED:

- Scissors
- Adhesive tape
- Glue
- Wires or small sticks colored green
- A large disposable cup. Place sand or stones in the bottom to weigh it down so that the flowers don't tip it over.

HOW TO MAKE IT:

1. Cut out the flowers, the balloon and the poem.
2. Tape a wire/stick behind each flower and the balloon.
3. If you want, you can add leaves cut from green paper to the stems of the flowers.
4. Glue the poem to the outside of the cup.
5. Place the flowers and the balloon in the cup. If you used wire, bend the tip of the stems so that some of the flowers are taller than others. Place your Bouquet of Contentment on a table or in a place where you will always see it.

INSTRUCTIONS FOR THE TEACHER:

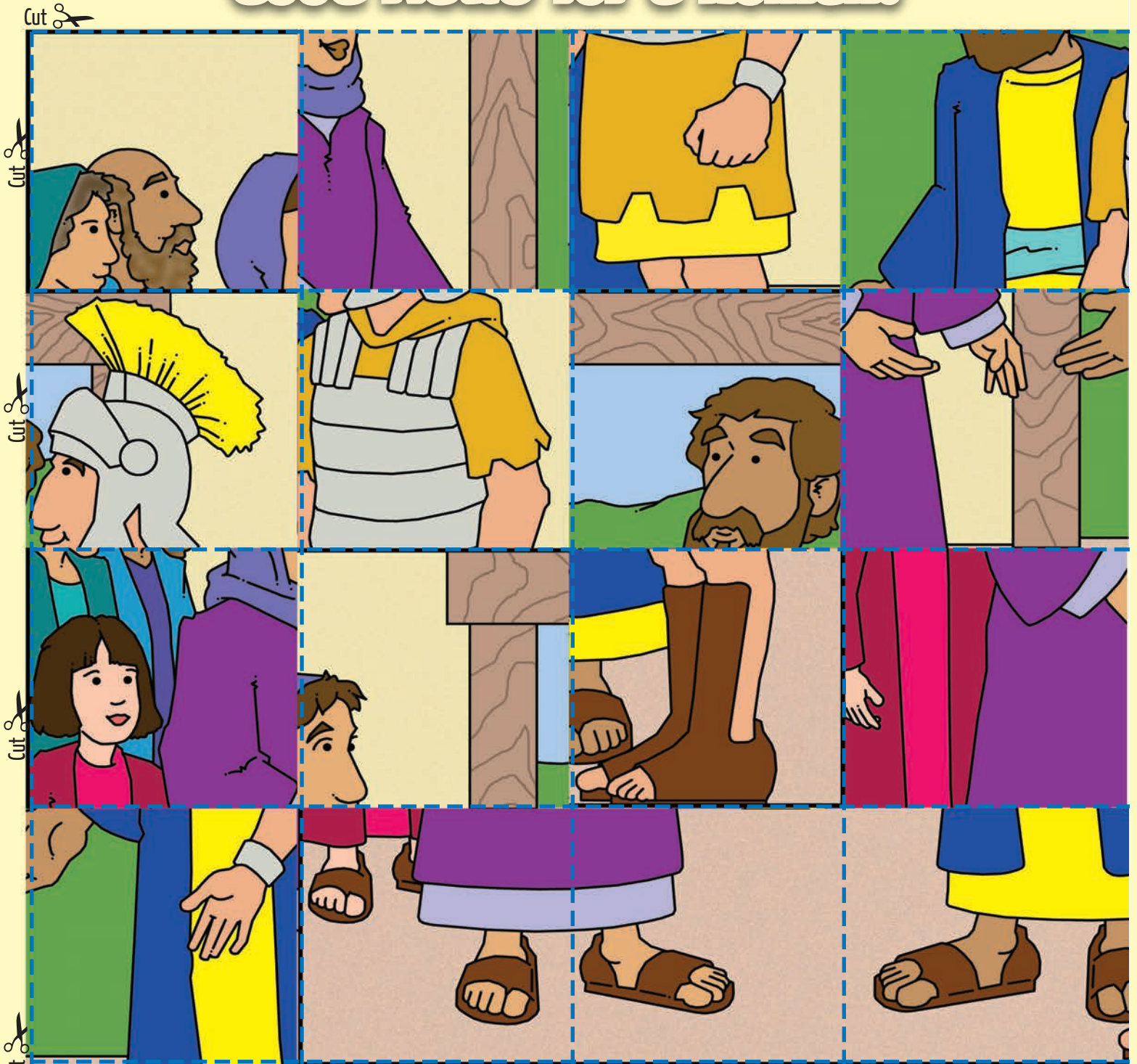

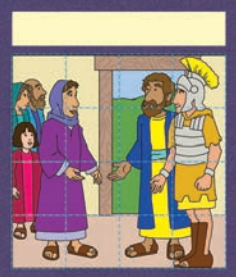
1. Cut out the two strips of paper along the dotted lines.

INSTRUCTIONS FOR THE TEACHER:

A Rainbow Promise

INSTRUCTIONS FOR THE TEACHER:

1. Let your students color the rainbow or decorate it with glitter or colored pompoms or whatever else you have to decorate with. Cut out the rainbow and bend it to form a cylinder. Then glue the edges in place.
2. Punch out the two circles at the top making two small holes. Put a piece of yarn or narrow ribbon 75 cm. long through the holes and tie a knot at the top.

The Gift of the Shepherds

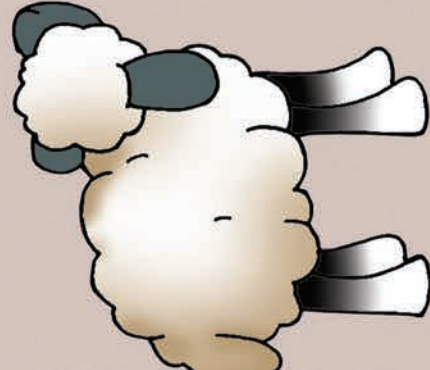
The shepherds were taking care of their sheep one night. Suddenly the sky was filled with light. An angel appeared.
